The course offers strategies for audience and task analysis, product learning, document design, drafting, procedure writing, and revision. Desktop publishing and/or online help development tools are used to produce a portfolio-quality print or online manual.

- Analyze audience, tasks, purpose and contexts of user and reference manuals.
- Create templates for manuals using desktop-publishing or online help development tools.
- Compose user or reference manuals in concise, user-oriented language that effectively addresses the audience's tasks and purposes.
- Estimate time to complete project.
- Design and conduct usability testing of manuals.
- Choose effective visual aids for manuals.

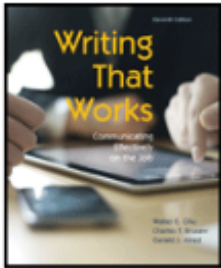
